



BIRDS OF CARL SCHURZ PARK CHECKLIST

Bring this checklist to the park and see how many birds you can find. To help with identification, make note of the bird's coloring, how it moves, if it's alone or with a group and where it is located. (Getting a photo also helps!) Record the date that you see a bird next to its name. That way, you'll have a better idea of when you can expect to see it on future visits to the park. The horticultural team uses bird-watching data to make sure we have adequate habitat for our avian friends.

You'll find 2 groups in this checklist: one with birds you can find year-round in the park, and the other with birds to look for during their migration seasons, usually fall and spring. You'll notice with birds like sparrows, some types are here year-round, while others just migrate through. An asterisk (*) indicates that a bird is included in our book, **Birds of Carl Schurz Park**. The list can also be downloaded from our website:
